Notification

The Royal Embassy of Cambodia has the honour to advise the public on the revised measures for prevention, containment and response to the spread of the Covid-19 for all travelers entering into Cambodia by air (all types of business aircrafts and charter flights), by land and water transport as follows;

- The temporary suspension of entry into Cambodia for foreign nationals from Iran, Italia, Germany, Spain, France and the United States as stated in the announcement of the Ministry of Health of Cambodia dated 14 and 15 March 2020, has been lift.
- All foreign travelers entering into Cambodia are required to possess a **medical certificate indicating a Covid-19 negative status** issued by competent health authorities of their residing country **no more than 72 (seventy-two) hours** prior to the date of travel and the proof of their **health insurance policy** with a minimum medical **coverage of not less than USD 50,000** (fifty thousand US dollars) during their intended duration of stay in Cambodia and must strictly comply with other additional measures as determined by the Royal Government of Cambodia.
- The requirements for medical certificate and insurance are waived for any official of foreign missions and international organizations holding Cambodian diplomatic visa (Visa A) or official visa (Visa B).
- Upon arrival in the Kingdom of Cambodia, all travelers, both Cambodian and foreign nationals, will be accompanied to a reception center for Covid-19 testing and be asked to stay there while waiting for laboratory results.
- In the event that one or more travelers is tested positive with Covid-19, other accompanying passengers will be subject to a 14-day quarantine at a location designated by the Inter-Ministerial Committee to Combat COVID-19.
- If all travelers are tested negative, they will be allowed to a 14-day self-isolation at their respective home under supervision of the local authorities and health officials. Moreover, they are required to take a Covid-19 test on the 13th day of the self-isolation.

These measures come into effect on 27 May 2020 and remain valid until having a new notification.
